Telco's Revenue Rises 5% in FY16



New Delhi: Vodafone India on Tuesday repor- ted a 5% jump in total revenue at ₹44,490 crore for the fiscal ended March 31, on the back of data growth and customer additions. The

company had posted a total revenue of ₹42,378 crore in fiscal 2014-15. The earnings before interest, taxes, depreci- ation and amortisation for the reported fiscal stood at ₹13,115 crore as against ₹12,598 crore in the previous year. Data revenue grew 45 per cent to Rs 8,263 crore in FY16 compared with Rs 5,690 crore last year.

"There is a strong uptake in data and our usage has gone up 63 per cent year-on-year. Shortly, our 4G services will be available in 1,000 towns across 9 circles in India," Vodafone India MD and CEO Sunil Sood said in a statement. -PTI
